## Teaching Children About Jesus

### Preliminary Remarks

- Work of God involves so many parts. No one can do it all, but everyone has a role to play – where do I fit in?
- What gifts has God given me and what is His purpose for my life?
- What can I do in the Lord's vineyard?
- What is my vision? What is my passion?
- Who has God sent me to?

# My background influenced my calling

- Raised in a Lutheran church in US, had the benefit of *learning Bible stories* in Sunday School and Vacation Bible School
- But accepted Jesus as Saviour only after coming to Nigeria. I wanted my children to learn as I had.
- In those years, most churches I saw here did not have a strong children's department with proper teaching
- Later, it became a burden to establish a strong children's department in our church and develop good teaching materials.
- I now feel a sense of urgency to teach children about Jesus

# Many Churches and homes neglect proper development of a Child

- Best pattern of development is that of Jesus in Luke 2 vs. 52: "Jesus grew in wisdom and stature and in favour with God and men."
- Parents often focus on physical and intellectual, neglect the social and spiritual.
- Churches often focus on youth and adult while children are to be kept quiet or busy.
  Yet, children are the future of the church.

### Why do we need to teach children? Because God commands it!

- "Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of God belongs to those who are like these children" (Mark 10 vs. 14).
- Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22 vs. 6).
- The soul of a child is just as important to God as that of an adult or youth. Jesus may come any moment or a child may pass early – if so, the souls of these children may be lost.

# Need to guard against evil influences

- Social media, internet and entertainment that encourage sinful behaviour so there is need for careful monitoring.
- Peer groups that influence rebellious behaviour so parents must know with whom their children interact
- Children must know their identity and authority as a child of God and be equipped to stand against evil.

# Importance of teaching children about Jesus

- Children become born again from an early age and can stand against temptations as they grow, also giving parents peace
- A child can be an open door for Christ to enter the home, bringing other children and even parents to church

### Catch them young!

- Much of a child's personality is formed by the age of 5 years. Lickona (1994) states that the foundation of moral development (understanding right from wrong) is laid from birth through 3 years of age.
- "Attitudes that a child learns during the first 5 to 7 years of his life become almost permanent."
- Between 1 and 7 years of age, a youngster is most susceptible to religious training. "Depriving a child of spiritual training severely limits his capacity to ever reach spiritual maturity."

- One author writes: "Prayer habits that last a lifetime are most often formed in childhood... kids can learn how they, too, can talk to their creator."
- What are the first words a child speaks?

## Characteristics of the child that make it easy to teach them about

- Jesus Sincerity
  - Accepting
  - Will easily take correction and change positively
  - Eager to learn
  - Ask questions to ensure they understand

#### Active

Each child is unique so no teaching method or style is 'right' for every child: therefore, need to be flexible to meet needs of each child.

# Never underestimate the ability of the child to learn

- Help children to maximize their potential; don't belittle their capacity to learn
- Provide them with opportunities to showcase their ability to demonstrate their knowledge of scriptures
- Must ensure adequate preparation or the children will give the teacher a lesson! Take this task very seriously.
- Church authority must make sure that those teaching in the children's department are themselves knowledgeable about the Bible.

### Provide a good role model

- Children are watching what we do and say. They are more affected by actions than words.
- An effective teacher must not be one that goes by the view "do what I say, don't do what I do".
- Children's teachers must be of good behaviour and appropriate appearance.
- It is not just anyone that should be entrusted with this important responsibility.

### **Teaching Biblical Truths**

- Keep it simple and focused on Jesus
- Use a translation of the Bible that is easy for them to understand – KJV uses unfamiliar language that even adults sometimes misinterpret
- Teach at their level don't expect them to understand higher level terminologies
- Teach the Bible as God's word, not a story book. Show how Old and New Testaments are integrated
- Encourage feedback make sure they understand by giving them a chance to express themselves.

# Make Learning about Jesus fun and interactive

- Don't over-spiritualize the relationship with God: let them speak to their Father in a manner natural to them.
- Give them a variety of means of presentation
- Different activities to keep them engaged and challenged
- Special programmes like VBS, Bible clubs, etc.

# Reward for consistency in children's ministry

- No greater reward than to see the children grow into fine Christian youth and adults but it takes years for the effect to be seen.
- It is worth the wait.
- Our experience with 32 years of Vacation Bible School. First year had 15 children, but in last few years have had about 600, to the glory of God!
